Paying in Full:

By choosing the instalment payment method the following fees apply: instalment administration fee of \$10.00 per instalment and instalment interest of 5.5%.



RATING INFORMATION

Rates make up about 53% of the Shire's revenue to fund local community infrastructure and services. Annual rates are calculated by multiplying the property's rating valuation by the rate in the dollar. Rating valuations are reviewed by Landgate Valuation Services each year for Unimproved Valuation (Rural) Properties and every six years for Gross Rental Valuation (Townsite) properties.

DIRECT DEBIT PAYMENT

Ratepayers have the option to pay their rates by continuous monthly instalments via Direct Debit. Full payment and instalment options amounts can also be deducted by direct debit. Contact the Shire on (08) 9883 4999, or visit the Rates page on the Shire website to obtain an application form.

2023/24 PRIORITY PROJECTS

Road Projects - Crossman, Lower Hotham, Harvey Quindanning Roads: \$1,357,461

Develop Mountain Bike Trails within the Old Town Dam site: \$510,000

Town Hall carpark and surrounding precinct improvements: \$521,426

Delivery of Community Gym in the Old Pavillion: \$239,000

Enhance Darminning (Ranford Pool) with improved facilities: \$200,000

Detailed design works for Boddington Caravan Park Upgrade: \$200,000

Improvements to the William St River Crossing: \$165,000

Chalkbrook Road Crossing remediation and improvements: \$161,639

Enhance the Interpretive Centre: \$100,000

Design and Install Regional Destination Signage: \$80,000

It is with pleasure that, on behalf of the Elected Members of the Shire of Boddington, I present the 2023/24 Budget. This year promises to be an exciting one as we continue to implement the Council Plan.

In the coming year the Shire will commence a number of projects including several elements identified within the Town Centre Revitalisation Plan, being the Town Hall Carpark and surrounding Precinct, as well as a mural within the Town Centre. The delivery of a community gym has been a long awaited facility in Boddington, with this expected to open in the summer months in the refurbished Old Pavilion.

Over 1.3M will be allocated to Shire roads, continuing the improvement program on Crossman, Lower Hotham and Harvey Quindanning Roads.

Many other projects are scheduled for the year including improvements to river crossings, upgrade of the old toilet block on the river foreshore, and enhancement of the Interpretive Centre.

Aged Care Accommodation continues to be a priority, with Council allocating funding for masterplanning of the site.

The planning for the upgrade of the Caravan Park and new chalets is continuing, with the Shire awaiting the outcomes of grant funding applications to support the funding required for this project.

While costs are increasing across the board, the delivery of projects is being achieved with rate increases that are inline with inflation, and for many residents this year will be the first rate increase in 3 years.

As Shire President I'd like to express my thanks to the community for their support, and to my fellow Councillors and staff at the Shire of Boddington for their work in the past year, and in preparing the budget for 2023/24.
